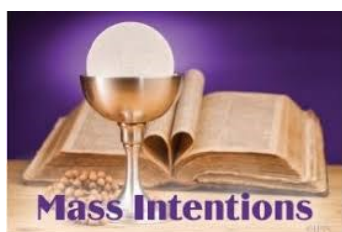

FROM FR. PAWEL

The miracle of healing can happen only when we are open to God. It requires honesty about ourselves and confidence in the power of God. Without faith, as today's gospel is teaching us, the miracle of healing is impossible. Then the opportunity of a better and more full life is passing us by, and the wounds are getting deeper.

Today we read in the Gospel that Jesus was powerless in the face of people's lack of openness and faith in His healing powers. His teaching was ineffective, His miracles of healing were few. His mission failed. He offered to those people new life, new dreams, new hope, and they rejected Him. Their prejudice, pride and arrogance were stronger than their desires to have a good life.

To take advantage of today's reading we may ask ourselves a few questions to better understand ourselves and God's work in our lives. We do not have to answer these questions all at once. They may become the self-reflections for the next few days or weeks. It could serve as the examination of our situations, our goals and our attitudes towards God and ourselves.

-Do I believe that Christ is able to carry me through life, attend my wounds and cure my afflictions?

-Am I open and honest in my search for God's healing in my life?

-If the answer is "yes", do I act with a humble heart and realization that I am a sinner and that God can cure my wounds and bruises only if I am honest with Him and myself?

-Do I have confidence in the power of healing through my faith and the person of Jesus Christ?

-Do I understand that faith means complete confidence in God, but also on my part living and acting according to His commandments?

-Do I strengthen my faith through prayer, mortification of my senses and charitable work?

-Do I believe that changes are possible if I lean on Him and leave behind my own ego and pride?

-Do I cherish the gift of hope or do I already give up the hope for a better tomorrow?

-What practical steps do I need to take to speed up the process or start the process of change recovery, the healing of old wounds, or just simply to obtain more faith in God?

PRO-LIFE

Don't let our government force you to pay for the deaths of unborn children.

On Friday, June 11, 2021 the Fiscal Year 2022 budget was released. It proposes to eliminate the Hyde Amendment and some related pro-life provisions. Calling for the elimination of the Hyde Amendment in a president's budget is unprecedented.

Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann, Chairman of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities issued a statement expressing deep concerns, saying: "I call on all government to work toward a budget that truly builds up the common good of all. This should include the President's budget submission that seek to protect vulnerable people. And it must also preserve the Hyde Amendment and related provisions which have protected millions of unborn babies, and mothers in difficult circumstances, from the tragedy of abortion."

Without the Hyde Amendment and related policies, billions of taxpayer dollars could be used to pay for abortion in the United States and throughout the world.

Don't let OUR government make you pay for the taking of innocent life.

Contact the White House and express your strong disagreement with the decision to force taxpayers to fund abortion on demand. At the same time, tell Congress to keep the Hyde Amendment and related policies and to oppose any bill that expands taxpayer funding of abortion.
