FROM FR. PAWEL

Reading today's Gospel, we may identify with the disciple's fear and uncertainty. In addition, we may detect their surprise and disappointment in Christ. He is with them, but He does nothing to protect or assure them in the time of trouble. It seems that He absolutely does not care what they are going through and what may happen to them. The disciples are terrified, hurt and feel abandoned.

In our boat of life, we can often feel the same way. We may be overwhelmed by the waves of fear and anxiety. We may cry out to God, all the saints and Heaven and feel unheard.

What is the answer to our fears and worries? The answer is confidence in the words of Jesus to have faith in Him.

God knows what is in our hearts. He knows the anguish, fear, and loneliness, along with joy, peace, and tranquility in us. He is familiar with the movements of our hearts. In the moment of high stress, He wants us to rely on Him, and to have confidence in Him. Do I have confidence in God? Each one of us needs to ask himself/herself that. And if we do, nothing can terrify or paralyze our actions and thoughts. With the confidence in God, we gain psychological comfort that things will work out one way or another because He oversees our fears and joys. We may relax and enjoy the ride since He is the one who controls.

Also, He is giving us very practical advice on what to do and how to react in the stressful, uncomfortable or fearful situations when everything seems lost. His advice addressing the storms of our lives are "Be quiet, be still!"

What does it mean in the practical terms? In stressful situations usually we are chaotic, depressed, wounded, down, scattered in our thoughts, emotions, and actions, often very talkative and unfocused. Christ is telling us to replace such reactions with opposite behavior. He advises be still, be quiet, do not make any extreme moves, do not react with high emotional intensity, do not be impulsive. Instead of that just be still, refocus, take time, calm down, regroup, breathe, pause for a moment, distance yourself, calm yourself down, and wait.

In other words, allow the hot stove of your emotions and fearful thoughts to cool down. Sooner or later when you imply the necessary time and space in any situation, you will see things from the distance, and in the more reasonable manner. Meanwhile, direct your time and energy temporarily to another goal. Channel the frustration into something positive and good. Do not react impulsively to life events with fear, anger or resentment toward yourself or others. Be creative, do not be stuck with the negativity and wait for the direction from the Holy Spirit.

To summarize the points:

1. Have unshakable confidence in Christ
2. Be quiet, be still in your reactions, impulses, and emotions.
3. Give time for your emotions to cool down.
4. With faith and confidence in God, in your heart, and the mind that is cooled down, proceed with the solution.

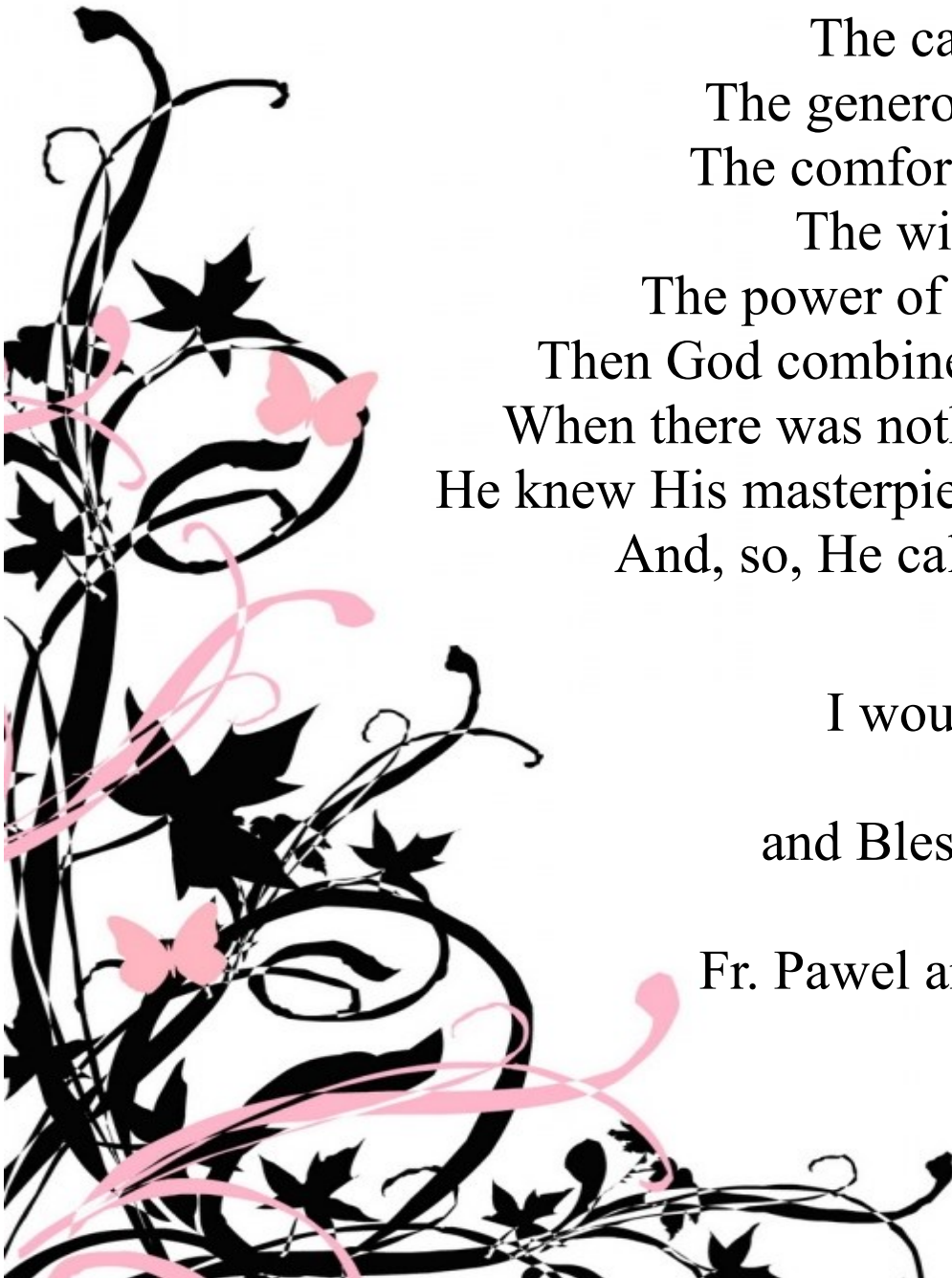
What Makes a Father
