### The Holy Trinity Sunday

In today's second reading St. Paul said, "you did not receive the spirit of slavery but the spirit of adoption". Those words are immensely helpful for us. We need to be reminded that in the presence of faith there is no place for any trace of slavery, sin, or fear. Faith, trust, and love takes away fear, distress, anger, and sin. Fear, anger, negativity, or harshness stands in clear contradiction to what we profess and believe.

Dear sisters and brothers, if you feel that in some areas of your life you are not who you aspire to be, that you may be a slave to your weaknesses and temptations, there is a solution; put your concerns on the side. Your job is to trust in God and His mercy. How can we practice it?

1. **Acknowledge your weaknesses** and the areas of your character that need some work. Stand in the bright light of honesty and humility in front of Christ and acknowledge your brokenness, despair, and doubts. This will create the feeling of cleanliness and purification in your heart. It will take away any burden of your faults, sins, and guilt. Shedding some tears in this process is natural. If you approach God with humility and honesty this will become a moment of your rebirth. You will take the burden of the past out of your system. By this humble act you flush out your ego, sins, and illusions. What is left is room for change, reconciliation, and new opportunities. Then, be grateful to God for the gift of allowing Him to be in your presence and to have the opportunity to communicate with him.

2. Next, it is good to acknowledge your weaknesses, but we cannot stop there. Another step must be taken. Ask Him to touch your spiritual and emotional wounds. Give all of that to Him, acknowledge your weaknesses and ask for help. **Ask God for help constantly**. Do not ask Him just once. Exercise your virtue of perseverance by asking Him over and over. Remember, it is a process, not a one time shot. It is a process of recovery from one stage of your life, when you experienced slavery and unhappiness, to another state of full freedom, dignity, and faith. Ask Him daily for help with determination; as your whole being, life and happiness depends on it, and with confidence that He will provide you the needed help.

3. **Finally, have patience with yourself and with God**. Ask Him over and over to guide you, but do not get easily discouraged if you do not see immediate results from your prayer. Have faith in God, in yourself and in the process. You may ask "how often do you have to acknowledge my poor condition, my distress, my weaknesses, and humble myself, and tell him about all of this? I already did it last week". You may even say, I did as you suggested already 7 times today! I will answer you with the encouragement from our Lord God; continue to do it as long as it is needed. Not just 7 times a day but 77 times a day! Your faith, trust and perseverance in prayer will open the gates of God's grace. Be persistent, be stubborn with God, be bold with Him in your pleads.

STATEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS

## *Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass*

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.
