FROM FR. PAWEL

In today's Gospel we heard about those who gave to God only from their surplus of their possessions. We also heard about the woman who trusted God unconditionally and without hesitation gave to Him all she had at this moment, her whole livelihood.

In our lives we can play it safe and throw God from our surplus of time, resources, commitment "a bone" and quiet the guilt of our hearts. Or we can do something more essential that would affect our whole future for the better. We can offer Him our livelihood, without condition, restriction and expectations. It is about a disposition of the heart to put trust in Him. It means to trust in His loving care, His providential plan for each of us and His acceptance of our human condition with our struggles, sins, temptations and weaknesses.

Doing things half way is not worth doing. This rule applies also to our lives in conquest for happiness and freedom. Happiness, freedom, and peace in our personal lives does not just happen. They need to be purchased often at a high cost. At the price of total commitment to the new perspective of life. First, our highway of lives must be clean from any obstruction. Then, we can travel to the desired destination.

What are things that hold you back my dear sisters and brothers? What are those things that you feel cause you to play it safe? Please identify those things. Take some time to think and write down the major obstacles to happiness, satisfaction and peace in your life.

After identifying the obstacles, imagine how your life would be different if you would change the pattern of your life, thinking and acting in this matter. Then, ask yourself what can be done to make it happen. What would be the specific steps you can take right now to snow ball the positive change in you? What would be your first step in this journey? Then, see the final product of whom you can become in a few years by the small choices you make today.

Those small steps, often not noticeable, have the power to turn into something positive and revolutionary. Rome was not built in a day, and that goes the same for you. Finally, commit yourself to work on those small steps. The holiness does not come at once. To give God our whole being involves years of practicing in the school of spirituality. But every step you take in this direction is the step to holiness and to achieve what you desire to become the best version of yourself.
